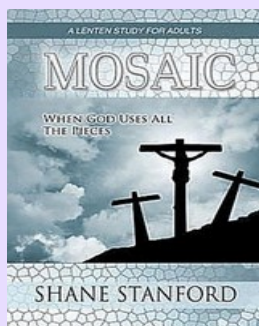

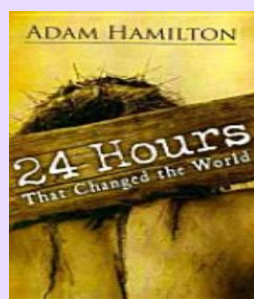


MOSAIC: When God Uses All the Pieces By Shane Stanford

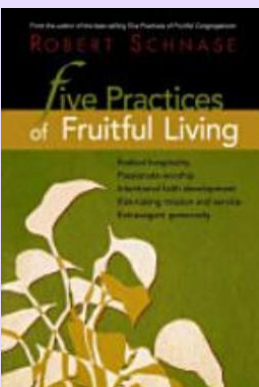


SPIRITUAL PARENTING
